
The truth is...

Daniel's Delayed Answer

In Daniel 9:1-19, we see God's faithful servant, Daniel, praying fervently for help, clarity and understanding. At first, nothing seemed to be happening. But after 21 days passed, Daniel received his answer. Remarkably, Daniel 10:1-12 reveals that the Lord heard Daniel's prayer and sent an answer the same day, but the forces of darkness fought against God's angelic messengers. Satan delayed the answer, but he couldn't deny it. This story reminds you that, while you wait, Satan is fighting your breakthrough at every turn. Though he may hold it up for a little while, he can't stop you from receiving your God-ordained answer.

The Woman with the Issue of Blood

In Mark 5:21-34, we read about a woman who had been bleeding for 12 long years. Can you imagine? She exhausted all her financial resources trying to find a cure. But after all the disappointment, she didn't give up hope! This tenacious woman exercised her faith and pressed her way through the crowd to get to Jesus. Lazarus Raised from the Dead

John 11:1-44 tells the story of Lazarus, Jesus' beloved friend, who died of an illness. FIRST CHURCH GUIDELINES (Revised as of 3-5-21)

PLEASE READ

In-person worship will begin **Sunday, March 14th**. Traditional service will meet again at 11:00 am. with a limited number of people in attendance to maintain social distancing. However, the date, times and additional services could change based on the federal, state and local government guidelines. It is VERY important for us to follow the guidelines.

IF WE FAIL TO KEEP THESE GUIDELINES, WE WILL NEED TO STOP INHOUSE WORSHIP.

Please use the online service option if you:

- Have flu like symptoms
- Fever of 100.4 degrees or higher in the past 14 days
- Exposure to anyone who has tested positive for COVID-19
- Have a family member who is waiting test results.
- Any medical reason where you or a family member is high risk
- If you are 65 or older per the Governor's recommendation and feel you are at risk
- Are uncomfortable with any of the procedures outlined
- Would rather stay at home

In-House person worship will remain "touchless"

- Doors will be opened at 10:45 am.
- · Allowed seating in pews will be marked
- MASKS are mandatory. (even with those who have had shots)
- No paper passing, no bulletins, no passing collection plates
- NO SINGING

With distancing and sanitizing requirements, the opening of the building will be limited to the sanctuary, 1st floor bathroom (emergency only) and hallways.

Only one entrance will be available for use. Please do not hinder the flow of people arriving and leaving service creating a bottle neck. You can visit outside of the building. Do not roam around the church building. This is to limit the number of locations that will need sanitized after the service. Certain items have been removed from the Sanctuary that could be touched and pass along COVID. That includes tables, nametags, pamphlets (upper rooms), hymnals, bibles, envelopes, pens, pew cushions, etc.

PLEASE DROP YOUR OFFERING INTO THE OFFERING PLATE NEAR THE ENTRANCE.

The sanctuary and the restroom will be disinfected before and after the service. We encourage everyone to bring their own masks, but the church will maintain a small supply in the event someone does not have one. Trash cans will be available for the disposable masks. A touchless hand sanitizer is available. Families will be able to sit together during the service

- o Service will be 30 to 40 minutes.
- o Use the no-touch thermometers to verify no one enters the church if their temperature is 100.4 degrees or higher.
- o We will dismiss rows at the end of service. Pastor will exit through the front doors first.
- o No singing yet (only humming)
- Social distancing needs to be maintained.
- No hand shaking or hugs.

Additional notes

- o church office will remain closed during the weekdays to the public.
- o Church will not yet be open for other organizations for meetings and other activities.
- o Church meetings will continue to be via ZOOM. Unless otherwise indicated.
- o The kitchens would not be available for use.

Please help us keep inhouse worship services ongoing.

IF WE FAIL TO KEEP THESE GUIDELINES, WE WILL NEED TO STOP INHOUSE WORSHIP.

The decisions of the RELAUNCH TEAM will be determined and guided by the CDC, Federal, State, and Local Government as well as the WV United Methodist conference advise that is safe to return to normal operations.

This entire document will be updated based on the conditions, environment, federal, state, and local guidelines as well as guidelines from the WV Annual Conference.


